



Criteria for Trailer- Full Truck Loads/ Bulk Trucks/ LTL Loads

*Set dock appointments for incoming and outgoing loads

1. Trailer must be clean and free of odd odors.
2. Trailer must be free of any hazardous material.
3. Rodent droppings, insects, or failure to pass a black light inspection will result in rejection of load.
4. Product should be in good condition and free of broken bags, films, or trays.
5. Product that is spoiled is not acceptable.
6. Product that is out of temperature range (32-42 F Butter, 23-45 F Eggs) is unacceptable.
7. Product transported on a refrigerated truck cannot be transported with any other product that may cause contamination. This includes raw produce, poultry, meat, fish, or any other potentially hazardous product.
8. Product should arrive on pallets that are clean and free of contamination.
9. We reserve the right to reject any ingredient if we feel it is a potential food safety hazard.

For Full Truck Loads:

1. Trailer seal must be on trailer. The seal must match the seal number printed on BOL. If the seal has been removed prior to arrival or by any non-Nonni's employee, a clear paper trail must exist showing the load origination, any stops made and the reason the seal was removed must be documented on the BOL. Additionally, management must approve the load of an unsealed trailer prior to accepting a load.

For Bulk Truck:

1. Trailer seal must be intact. The seal must match the seal number printed on BOL. If the seal has been removed prior to arrival or by any non-Nonni's employee, a clear paper trail must exist showing the load origination, any stops made and the reason the seal was removed must be documented on the BOL. Additionally, management must approve the load of an unsealed trailer prior to accepting a load.

For LTL Loads Criteria:

1. The trailer does not need a seal. But the carrier will need to send Nonni's Foods proof of liability in the event the pallets get into a cross contamination situation. The trailer cannot have any items which could potentially be a cause of product contamination. This includes items with strong odors, chemicals, etc. If any load arrives with questionable trailer condition or potential contaminants on board the trailer must be reviewed by management prior to acceptance or refusal.
